
Dear Mr. Suter:

I write to correct a misstatement I made during oral argument yesterday in the above-captioned cases.

In the course of my argument, I stated that, “[w]ith one exception,” the ACLU had never broadcast advertisements with a tag line asking the audience to call a specific Senator or Congressman. Tr. of Oral Arg. 25-26. The ACLU has directed my attention to pages 14 through 19 of its amicus brief, which lists three such ads or groups of ads. (In one, the named Senators were not candidates for re-election; the other two were apparently run in non-election years.)

I appreciate the ACLU’s prompt attention to this misstatement and apologize for any confusion it may have created.
