The Supreme Court currently has before it a petition for cert to review Randall v. Sorrell and Landell v. Sorrell, in which the U.S. Court of Appeals for the 2nd Circuit ruled that campaign spending limits can be constitutional. These cases, reviewing Vermont's 1997 campaign spending limits law, present a new interpretation of Buckley v. Valeo, the Court's notable 1976 decision.
